

FACT SHEET

Robin Hood Airport Doncaster Sheffield is the first *full-service* airport to be built in Britain in over 50 years. This £80 million development by Peel Airports Ltd has transformed the former RAF Finningley base in South Yorkshire into a brand new 'personality' airport under the Robin Hood banner. It is estimated that more than 7,000 jobs will be created.

THE LOCATION

- Ideally located in the Yorkshire and Humber region - an Objective 1 an EU funded area
- Easy access to national motorway links including M62 (Hull to Liverpool), M1 (London to Leeds), M18 (Sheffield M1 to Goole M62), M180 (Scunthorpe and Grimsby) and the A1 (London to Edinburgh)
- Doncaster - Lincoln railway line runs close by and a direct connection to the airport is offered by the Airport Arrow Shuttle service. An on-site rail station is planned in the long term.

THE FACILITY

- The runway measures almost 3,000m long by 60m wide - second only to Manchester in the North of England and easily capable of supporting long-haul aircraft
- A range of long and short-haul, leisure and scheduled passenger flights operate
- Airport operates 24 hours a day
- The 800-acre airport infrastructure also supports all manner of ancillary business and services including the **Directions Finningley** training/recruitment facility and future development of an associated National Aviation Academy

CAPACITY

- The Airport aims to cater for 2.3 million passengers and 50,000 tonnes of freight each year
- Its huge UK catchment is in excess of 5 million people within one hour's drive time, encompassing areas east of the Pennines including South Yorkshire, North Nottinghamshire, North Lincolnshire and beyond
- A key area of focus is to attract inbound passengers from around the world, utilising the 'Robin Hood' name and legend to create an attractive tourism proposition and offering a gateway centrally located to service tourism in Yorkshire, Lincolnshire, Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire

- Wizz Air operate 3 x weekly flights to Poland (Katowice/Cracow) commenced 19 September 2006 and will fly to Gdańsk (Poland) from 15 July 2007 operating 4 times a week with flights on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays & Sundays
- Flybe offer double daily services to Belfast City Airport commencing 29 October 2006
- Weekly direct flights to Toronto commence May 2007 with Flyglobespan
- Shaheen Air to operate at least 2 weekly direct scheduled flights to Pakistan (Islamabad) to commence by the end of 2006
